#### PRIME AREAS

#### **COMMUNICATION AND LANGUAGE**

By the end of this half term, we will have listened to stories and responded to them by answering questions and demonstrating our understanding through our play and acting out the stories using props and puppets. We will have followed instructions and spoken to others in different situations. We will have taken part in circle time activities discussing managing our feelings and developing critical thinking.

# LITERACY Buthe and

SPECIFIC AREAS

By the end of this half term, we will have recapped our level 2 sounds and tricky words and continued learning our level 3 sounds ur, ow, oi, ear, air, ure, er along with recapping all of level 3 sounds and tricky words. We will have used these phonemes to read and write words and simple sentences.

We will have read stories related to our topic and used the texts as stimulus for our writing. We will apply our writing skills to writing for different purposes across our indoor and outdoor provision.

In Guided reading, we will have read our banded and patterned reading books and demonstrated understanding of what we have read by answering key questions.

#### PHYSICAL DEVELOPMENT

By the end of this half term, we will have further developed our control over balls by pushing, patting, throwing, catching and kicking them to and from our partners.

We will have explored how to move to a range of different music types and recognised the ways in which our bodies move. We will discover how to move our bodies by stretching up high and crouching down low.

We will have continued to keep our 'funky fingers' moving in the provision to develop our fine motor skills.

#### **MATHEMATICS**

By the end of this half term, we will be more confident measuring length, height, mass and capacity using a range of resources such as sizing rings, balancing scales and measuring jugs.

We will have looked closely at the composition of numbers 6, 7, 8, 9 and 10 working out number bonds for each total.

We will have looked at how to combine two groups of numbers and found out how to make pairs and double numbers.

We will have investigated 3D shapes and found examples of them in our provision.

#### UNDERSTANDING THE WORLD

By the end of this half term, we will have observed, commented on, and asked questions about aspects of our familiar world including plants growing, animals, natural and found objects. We will have talked about why things happen and how things work to develop an understanding of growth, decay and changes over time. We will have shown care and concern for living things and the environment by caring for our plants both inside the classroom and outdoors in our garden area.

#### PERSONAL, SOCIAL, EMOTIONAL DEVELOPMENT

By the end of this half term, we will have developed our conversational skills through small group activities.

We will have explained our knowledge and understanding and by asking appropriate questions of others.

We will have looked at how to care for our mouth and teeth

#### **EXPRESSIVE ARTS AND DESIGN**

By the end of this half term, we will have looked at how we can use mixed colours to create paintings. We will have looked at famous artists who have painted plants and flowers. We will have investigated and replicated different animal prints. We will have constructed with blocks, construction kits and junk modelling to achieve a planned effect. We will have learned songs related to our topic and explored ways of moving to different music and sounds. We will have represented stories we have read or heard through our play during role play, retelling stories with small world objects.
