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<b>English and speaking and listening</b>	Ask an adult at home what their favourite book was when they were your age. Why did they like it? Can you find a copy and read it together?	Can you write a diary like Samuel Pepys did? Remember to write the date each day.	Have you heard any fireworks? Write a list of adjectives to describe them. 	Speak to an adult about poetry. Do they know any poems? Do they have a favourite poem? Which kinds of poems do you like to read?
<b>Maths and problem solving</b>	Practise your number bonds with the number bonds sheet.	Ask an adult to write some addition or subtraction number sentences for you. Solve them on a number line. Can you write a word problem to match them?	Practise your 2, 5 or 10x tables to help you with your Big Maths on Fridays.  How quickly can you answer them? Which materials can you see? What are their properties?	With everyone in your home, check that your smoke alarms work and write a fire escape plan for your home.
