<u>Author of the Term</u>




During the Spring term, we are celebrating the author Liz Pichon! Liz Pichon is an author and illustrator. Initially, Liz was an illustrator, illustrating for other authors but then she soon became an author herself. Liz is dyslexic and never thought that she could write books. She thought "that world was closed to me." However, she has become a hugely successful author and has won many awards for her Tom Gates series. Liz Pichon's books have also been translated into 44 different languages.

Liz grew up enjoying reading the Asterix and Beano comics. Liz enjoys using fonts and illustrations to help to tell the story. She also writes songs for Tom's band, 'Dog Zombies' which can be heard on the live stage show of her books and her audio books.


1000 useful WORDS Religion
