TERM TIME LEAVE

- If you plan to take your child out of school you need to inform us at least 20 days before. We ask that you provide evidence (flight tickets) and fill in a term time leave form to request term time leave from school.
- We may only authorise term time leave in exceptional circumstances. (returning to home country for a family visit is not classed as exceptional).
- If your child is away from school for more than a few days the Local Authority may issue you with a £80 fine per child, per parent- this increases if you do not pay the fine within a certain time period.
- Springfield School do not issue or collect the fines- the Local Authority does
- Taking extended leave damages your • child's education- it's not always possible for them to catch up on their missed learning.
- All requests will be considered by the • headteacher but it is highly unlikely the request will be authorised.
